Please allow me to wish you prosperity, happiness and good health in 2020. My wish is that all stakeholders will work in harmony together to achieve our main educational aim: **QUALITY LEARNING AND TEACHING THROUGH QUALIFIED TEACHERS IN A SAFE ENVIRONMENT.**

From this year there will be more focus on the neatness of books; please cover all books on/before Monday 3 February. Cursive handwriting with a blue pen or pencil is compulsory, the educational value of cursive writing is very important and cannot be measured in money! All educators have received a document on the importance of cursive writing and will explain it to their learners. There are still outstanding textbooks from 2019, this is unacceptable and these learners will not receive a new text book unless they bring their old text books back or pay R200 for each new text book. We urge parents to see that their children bring Irish Lines writing books and Nature Study books for Gr. 4 as well as Nature Study books for Gr. 5-7. The Department of Education did not supply these books.

Welcome to all new parents, you are now part of the Good Shepherd Family and your child is in one of the best no fee schools in the country. Use this opportunity to encourage your child to be present every school day and prepare them to consistently work hard. Remember discipline and education starts at home.

A special word of welcome to new members of staff from this year. Ms. Zola Lukwe (Gr. 2 Teacher) is a placement from the Department of Education and was formerly an educator at Clumber Primary Farm School, Bathurst. Mrs. Cindy Bokbaard was appointed as new administrator/secretary, after Ms. Samantha Galada successfully applied for a promotion post at the Fort Beaufort District Office. Ms. Bokbaard come from Graeme College where she worked as an aftercare manager and administrator. We trust that these colleagues will enjoy their new working environment and will be happy at our school. Congratulations must also go to our educators who study part time. Excellent results were achieved in their 2019 exams. Well done to Mrs. Christian, Mr. Accom and Ms. Gongqobe. We are extremely proud of you.

We invite our parents to submit their CV's for the position of meal servers at the school. At this stage there are two positions. The due date to hand your CV in at the Admin Office is 5 February 2020 and successful candidates will start on 28 February 2020.

The athletics season will start from next Wednesday, we will use the Victoria Primary Sport Grounds. From this year we will involve all learners from Gr. 1-7. Practises will be from 14:00-15:00.

Basketball practices will start on Monday 27 January at St. Andrews. Transport will be available, please pack in an extra lunch pack for your child.

The opening of the academic year and the induction of the 2020 Monitors will take place in the Cathedral on Tuesday 21 January. We invite all parents to join us from 12:00 for this special occasion. After the formalities we will come back to school and the learners will be dismissed earlier (13:15).

Although we are a no fee school we remind our parents from Gr. 1-7 to donate R100 per term and to send donations of A4 photostat paper, toilet paper, tissues, etc. to the different class teachers. Gr. R parents must pay compulsory school fees of R350 per month over a period of ten months.

All parents will receive a Code of Conduct to sign, we are worried that some of our learners do not adhere to the rules of the school, for example: untidy and long braids, ill disciplined learners, etc.

Quality second hand clothes will be on sale every Friday from the office. We urge parents to please mark all clothes with a permanent marker.

A special parent afternoon will be held in the last week of January. Parents will visit the different class teachers in their classrooms. We will send an invitation with a date to you.

There will be an inspection on Monday morning during Assembly. Please make sure that your child is neatly dressed in the correct school uniform and their hair, etc. is according to the school rules.
